

**Gurgaon First is delighted to be a part of "Join Hands to Save Hands" a workshop that focuses on the safety of workers in the automobile sector on August 11, 2019 at 4 pm at Gurgaon Industrial Association Auditorium, Opposite Sector 14, Gurugram.**

**The two-hour workshop will feature a panel discussion by experts and launch of Accident Prevention Report "Crushed".** The workshop is being organised by Safe in India Foundation (SII) that was started in 2015 by three alumni of IIMA, to address the issue of crush injuries to the hands/fingers of the workers in factories in Gurugram. However, the issue is relevant nationally as 80%+ of these accidents happen in the supply chain of auto-sector. In this effort, SII had conducted an analysis of 1000+ such accidents and shared this Report and its findings and recommendations with key stakeholders in the government and the industry last year, and has been in constructive discussion with them. This report, updated with data from even more workers and responses from the government and industry, is being publicly released in August, 2019.
